#### How did you find out about it?



## How long have you been in the industry?

I started riding seven and a half years ago and have not looked back.

It has boosted my confidence a lot. Not just by expanding my knowledge but I have developed skills working within a team and with clients. I have learnt to believe in myself and the fact that everything is achievable if given effort and commitment.



# What advice would you give to someone looking to come into the industry or looking to start an apprenticeship?

Don't give up, follow your dreams, its hard work. Not just the physical work on the yard, but also the course work, but worth it in the end. Everyone deals with things differently. I found some of the theory bits hard but if I revised and asked for help it was better. You will get through it, I did.

I am going to give myself a couple of years just gaining more work skills, then consider my next option. Who knows, I might even go on to do the Level Three?!

## What would you say to someone who is thinking of doing an apprenticeship?

If you like to work and want to get a qualification, this is the way to go. You get to do the things that make you happy, work with great people and learn.
